#### **Charitable Donation Scheme**

#### **Cancellation of Cemetery Mass**

In light of the recent government guidelines on outdoor gatherings it has been decided to defer the cemetery mass scheduled for Wednesday next in St. Coolan's. Apologies for any inconvenience.

It is hoped that blessing of graves in all our cemeteries will take place as usual in November.

#### Advice on face covering at Mass

Wearing of face masks in church is now recommended by the Irish bishops. Those who are reading and celebrants do not have to wear them throughout the liturgy. Remember, if you feel unwell or have a cold do not attend church.

#### **Graveyard maintenance**

We would ask families who have graves in St. Cronan's Graveyard Tuamgraney to please tidy them up and not to leave their litter lying around after cleaning the graves. Thank you for your co-operation.

Please note: The refuse bins at St. Joseph's Church Tuamgraney are only for Church and Parish House rubbish. Please do not use them for household refuse.

**Please note** that for the moment no collection baskets will be passed around at Mass - instead boxes are available at each door for your donation. You can also make an online payment by going to the diocesan website - killaloediocese.ie - and following the steps clearly indicated for each parish.

#### Planning to get married in 2021?

You need to give at least six months notice for the completion of church and civil papers and so it would be a good idea to contact Fr. David to chat through the necessary requirements. This applies whether you are getting married in the parish, elsewhere in Ireland or overseas.

Parish Pastoral Council: It is hoped that we will be able to hold a meeting of the PPC in September, to restart the work that was interrupted by Covid19 and to put into place a plan for our future development as a parish.
