## 2021 Envelopes

We only have a few envelopes left in our current boxes. The new boxes are ready but will not be available in the churches until we are again able to attend mass. In the meantime anyone that wishes can arrange to collect their own new box and that of a neighbour or friend from the Tuamgraney office during office hours. Please note that **Anniversary Masses** can still be booked through the Parish Office on 087 1498763, but will be **online only** due to Covid-19 restrictions.

Celebration of Mass: Current restrictions mean that mass is available online only at 10am every day except Saturday. Churches are open for private prayer - if you visit please be considerate of others and wipe seat and surfaces afterwards. Funerals may only have 10 people present. Weddings are limited to 6 guests. Thank you for your co-operation and understanding.

Catholic Schools Week 2021 runs from 24th-31st January. The theme this year is 'Catholic Schools: Communities of Faith and Resilience'. Catholic schools are inspired by the belief that God has created each one of us with a capacity to give love and receive love. This love is bound in faith and is more resilient than any virus.
