

Celebration of Mass

A reminder that Mass is available online at 10am each morning, except Saturday, through the parish website and you can watch the mass later during the day at the same site. Churches are open for private prayer. If you visit please be considerate of others and wipe seat and surfaces afterwards. Funerals may only have 10 people present. Weddings are limited to 6 guests.
